## HOW LONG CAN A FAMILY STAY?

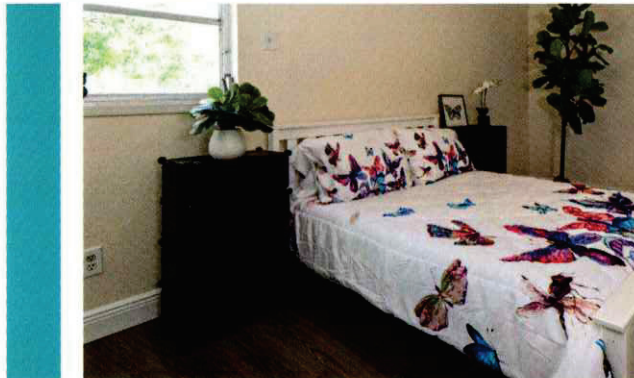
Families can stay on a short term transitional basis. The end goal is for the family to have enough time to find employment, save up first, last, and security and move into permanent housing.
