Each time I write this newsletter it reminds Margaret and me of a time long ago when we decided that we would get involved with an "element of faith" to help little children have a better life. We had no money for support and very little understanding about how to operate through a non-profit. Our first action was to step out on the path called faith. For the past few years, we had lived in Texas where I attended seminary. We had two young children and a great love for the Lord and each other. My need to understand the Bible was the driving motivation in my life.

Allow me to provide a glimpse into my schedule in those years. The day began around 2:00 AM when I picked up two other men to work with me in cleaning a car dealership and theater. At 8:00 AM I had Greek and Hebrew classes, by 1:00 PM, New Testament Theology and Old Testament. Then went home for a bite to eat and rushed out the door to mow lawns until about 5:30 or 6:00. Went home to shower, eat and study about 4-5 hours. Before I knew it, it was time to get up and go again. It was a hard schedule, but we made it. God provided us a nice little house to live in and later a little church to pastor in the poor part of Ft. Worth. Every day was filled with hope that things would get better and faith that God would supply. And He did!!

Providing for the poor and hurting has been one of the greatest blessings of our lives. The Bible is full of promises to those who help the poor and to those who don't. For Example: Proverbs 21:13, "Those who shut their ears to the cries of the poor will be ignored in their own time of need", and Psalms 41:1, "Oh, the joys of those who are kind to the poor". Please pray that we will do all we can to make life better for the little children at My Father's House. We are going through some difficult times, but we will keep our faith strong, trusting Jesus will never stop.

Thanks for your gifts to the ministry. Everything is OK at the orphanage. Pastor Predestin is struggling with the best way to get pure drinking water for the children.
